7. An exhibitor may enter in one or more sections in each class.
8. Exhibits must remain until 5:00 p.m. Sunday, August 13th.
9. Winners of awards/trophies will be contacted and can pick them up at the Aylmer fair Board Office or make arrangements with the office to pick them up.
10. Judge's discretion is final on place standings.

Points awarded for the attractiveness of the display with both colour and variety stressed. Prizes awarded at the discretion of the judge to worthy exhibits.

2. Special Uses of a Variety of Vegetables and/or Fruits. Both raw and preserved should be included. No commercial preserved products allowed. Not all preserved products need to be shown in their raw form nor vice versa. Maximum size 4 ft. x 3 ft. Points awarded for the attractiveness of the display with colour, variety of kinds and variety of uses to be considered. Products and uses must be labeled. Judge must consider the exhibit worthy of a prize.
