- 3. **Animal Identification:** Animals may only be shown with an original pedigree or Animal Inquiry Sheet from Holstein Canada for identification. In keeping with national health, bio-security interests, and breed identification rules, all Canadian dairy animals must be security tagged to show one tag pair in each ear with all four component parts identically numbered. One of these must be an RFID tag. All US animals must carry USDA tags. Moreover, in order for US exhibitors to enter Canada, an import permit must be granted from the Canadian Food Inspection Agency.

Calculation of Premier Breeder is readily determined in all identified cases from Certificates of Registry, either directly from the breeder section or, in the case of a within-herd family transfer with former membership and alphanumeric code, by utilization of the animal's prefix. In the case of jointly-bred animals, a joint breeding unit may be counted as a separate group for the Premier Breeder, if the Breeders wish to. Notice must be given to the Holstein Field Rep prior to the show to prepare for proper calculation of the points. If not, the points will be awarded to the exhibitor whose prefix is on the animal at the time of the show. Points to be awarded on the following basis:


