


Figure 8 Heats & Feature Powder Puff Figure 8

General Rules:

- 1. It is the responsibility of each exhibitor to comply with Federal health regulation.
- 2. Each exhibitor will be required to sign the cod of Ethics from Holstien Canada
- 3. Animal Identification: in keeping with national health, bio-security interests, and breed identification rules; all Canadian Dairy Animals must be tagged to show- one tag pair in each ear with all four component parts identically numbered. One of these must be a RFID tag. All US animals must carry USDA tags. Moreover, in order for US exhibitors to enter Canada, an import permit must be granted from the CFIA.

Class Rules:

- 1. Entries restricted to Elgin County Holstein Breeders only.
- 2. All entries MUST be entered online at www.assitexpo.com by August 4, 2025.
- 3. All Entries must be registered 75% or higher in the Holstein Canada Herd Book.
- 4. Showing will start promptly at 6pm
- 5. Registration certificates must accompany each entry to the ring for identification purposes., This is the responsibility of the exhibitors.

1. The Haldrey Special, Pre 4-H Showmanship

Open to children who will be at least five years old by December 31, 2025 but not yet eligible for 4-H. Participants must be a resident of Elgin County and a family member involved in the agricultural industry, preferably in the dairy sector.

The class will be judged for showmanship only however, the calf should be a dairy breed, and of a size appropriate and manageable by the showman and presented in reasonable show-ring condition. The showman should be able to lead the calf by him/herself, without assistance.

The family asks that parents consider these first two rules for safety reasons.

Entries to be made on Assist Expo for the Elgin County Holstein Show for the official catalogue.

Late entries will be accepted at ringside up to 30 minutes prior to the show.

Medallions will be presented to 1st, 2nd and 3rd place exhibitors.

- 2. All adult entrants must pay a \$12.00 entry/membership fee (unless stated otherwise in the prize book).
- 3. Every exhibit must belong to and be the work of the person entering it.
- 4. All soiled, defaced, or old work will be disqualified by the judge.
- 5. Any deception found, the Board shall withhold any prize awarded to any entrant.
- 6.All articles must be placed at the time specified at the heading of each department and no entries will be accepted after that time.
- 7. All category rules must be followed exactly.
- 8. All entries must have an entrant tag attached.
- 9.All livestock/animals, while on the fair property, must be secure.
- 10. All entries must be brought to the fairgrounds on entry day. The Fair Board will not be responsible for entries left or mailed in.
